

Scholarship Information

Below is a list of scholarships that have been communicated to Miller in the last number of years. We will add scholarships as we receive information and try to ensure all scholarships are still current. This is NOT a list of all the available scholarships. Check the scholarship board in Guidance regularly and listen to announcements. Use data bases to find scholarships. Post-secondary Institutions also have their own scholarship, application process and offer workshops on how to access their scholarships.

There are more scholarships in databases such as the [Scholar Tree site](#), as well as the [Scholarship Canada site](#).

Search any scholarships that are of interest to you, and carefully read all of the information for each scholarship. Check to see if you meet the qualifications and have completed all that is required for the application.

All French Immersion student should check the Provincial/ Federal Study in French Bursaries and scholarships.

Those students involved in activities outside of school should also check those associations for scholarships. As an example, Hockey Regina and Cheer Saskatchewan have scholarships for their participants.

Students should also check their places of employment or their parent's places of employment for scholarship opportunities.

In addition to these scholarships, Miller gives out a number of Leadership Awards at graduation each year. Any graduating student is eligible for these awards. To be considered for one of Miller's Leadership Awards, students must complete the 'Student Involvement Form' available each year in March/April.

1800 Wheelchair (2 X \$500)

Open to all students. Students must write a poem, in a style of their choosing, on the theme of overcoming a personal challenge.

Application deadline is May 31.

A Voice for Animals Contest (multiple awards)

Students who have a passion for animal rights are encouraged to look at the criteria for this contest. Application period is usually January to March (annually).

The Access Communications Centennial Scholarship

Access Communications Co-operative Limited believes that youth who volunteer their time in order to improve their communities should have their efforts encouraged and rewarded. The Access Communications Centennial Scholarship Program recognizes graduating students who demonstrate exemplary community involvement as well as academic achievement.

The deadline is usually mid-March.

Affinity Credit Union Build a Better World Scholarships (\$1000 each)

For those planning to attend their first year of university, college or trade school within the next year. Each year, Affinity Credit Union awards a \$1,000 scholarship to 30 people starting their post-secondary education.

In addition, Affinity Credit Union offers the Elwood Harvey Co-operative Leadership Program for Grade 11 students. This is a unique and rewarding opportunity for students to learn about money, leadership, co-operatives and a whole lot more. This program is designed for young Affinity Credit Union members who aspire to make a big difference in their community and each winner will receive \$2,500 to fund their education.

The deadline for Affinity Scholarships has been February 15th.

Agriculture Student Scholarship (\$3000)

Saskatchewan Grade 12 students and recent high school graduates (within the last two years) have the chance to win a grand-prize scholarship of \$4,000 or one of three runner-up scholarships of \$2,000 when they submit a three-minute video or 1,000-word essay on transparency. This year's scholarship theme encourages youths to explore their idea of transparency in agriculture and how it affects public perception of the industry.

To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must be planning to take an agriculture-related post-secondary education program beginning in the fall of 2022. This scholarship program has been designed to identify young people who are planning to pursue a career in the agriculture industry.

AIA and the University of the Aftermarket Foundation Scholarship (\$1000)

Selected candidates receive a \$1,000 scholarship. While all students are encouraged to apply, priority in awarding scholarships will be given to those pursuing a career in the automotive aftermarket. As a bonus, a matching grant is awarded to scholarship recipients who become technicians in the automotive aftermarket. You may claim your matching grant up to one year after graduation. Please note: Students must be enrolled full-time for the year of the scholarship. For instance, if you apply this year, you must be enrolled for the academic year starting September of this year up to May or June of the following.

Application deadline June 15.

Assignment Saving Lives Bursary Program (Awards up to \$1250)

How does the program work?

We are asking students to recruit 15 blood donors who will donate at any of our blood donation events in Canada from April 1 to June 30. Participants who are successful in recruiting 15 or more donors who have attended their appointments during the program timeframe, have a chance to win a bursary of up to \$1250 to be applied towards post-secondary tuition fees for those who are enrolled no later than January 31, 2022. Participants will gain hands-on experience, developing leadership, project management and communication skills. Registration is open until May 31. The recruitment period ends on June 30.

ATCO Indigenous Education Awards Program (\$500-\$1500)

Awards are presented to select Indigenous students (**Merit** - \$500 for students completing Grades 10-12, including upgrading; **Bursary** - \$1000 for students registered in a trade, community, or technical college diploma program; **Scholarship** - \$1500 for university or graduate degree students) who demonstrate leadership capabilities and commitment in their quest for higher education. To be considered for an award, students must complete an online application form and submit the required documentation, including reference letter, proof of enrollment for upcoming school semester, short essay (500-1000 words) describing why you are a suitable candidate, and recent school transcript. The deadline is usually August 15.

Automotive Industries of Association of Canada

There are 3 different scholarships for students entering programs in the automotive aftermarket industry. This includes automotive apprenticeship, auto body, hard parts, heavy duty mechanic or machinists. Deadlines for these scholarships vary.

Automotive Women's Association Foundation

Scholarships are awarded to female, North American citizens, with a passion for a career or advancement in

the automotive and its related industries. While AWAF members and family members are encouraged to apply for scholarships, we encourage applicants who are not affiliated with the organization to apply as well. To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants should be already accepted to or enrolled in an accredited collegiate program, with a 3.0 or higher GPA and a citizen within North America. We accept applications throughout the year.

Ayn Rand Novels

The Ayn Rand Institute sponsors annual essay contests that offer 600 prizes and \$100,000 in prize money every year.

Essay contest details are available after students create an account. Applications deadlines are in April.

Bayer Fund Opportunity Scholarship Program

This scholarship is for students who have farm backgrounds and who plan on pursuing post-secondary education in the area of agriculture. Multiple awards of \$1500.00 (over 50) are given out annually.

The application deadline is the end of May.

B. Davis Scholarship (\$1000)

Available to all high school students. This is not an academic scholarship, but we would like to know where you are going to school now and what your future academic plans are. To apply for this scholarship, students need to write an essay of less than 1000 words on a specific topic.

Application deadline is May.

The Beaverbrook Vimy Prize

Win a scholarship to study abroad for free next summer. Relive history and learn about how Canada became the great nation it is today by visiting First and Second World War battlefields, historic sites and memorials. To win: you must be 15-17 years of age and submit an essay or project that is based on a question posted on the Vimy Foundation website.

The deadline is the beginning of March.

Bill Mason Scholarship Fund (\$2000)

Paddle Canada is proud to award this annual scholarship to assist with the education of tomorrow's environmental stewards - those people who help make a difference in the kind of world we live in today and pass on to future generations.

This scholarship usually has a September deadline.

Brandon Walli "Phones Down, Eyes Up" Memorial Scholarship (3 awards @ \$2500)

The Brandon Walli "Phones Down, Eyes Up" Memorial Scholarship is open to Canadian students graduating secondary school who are pursuing a post-secondary education in the arts, creative arts or music. Geotab is proudly hosting this scholarship in Brandon Walli's name for students who show the same love of arts and music that Brandon possessed. Brandon Walli tragically lost his life at the age of 23 while crossing the road in 2016.

Brandon and his father Tom Walli shared a passion for music, and so this scholarship is a continuation of that, hopefully bringing enrichment and joy into the lives of others through the arts and music, as it did for them.

Who should apply:

- Grade 12 students who are focusing on Arts, Creative Arts, or Music in their post-secondary school studies.
- We are looking for students who also have community and volunteer experience.

Deadline the end of April.

Burger King Scholars Program

In memory of Burger King co-founder James W. McLamore. Scholarship grants range from \$1,000 to \$50,000 and are intended to help students offset the cost of attending college or post-secondary vocational/technical school. Recipients are selected based on their grade point average, work experience, extracurricular activities and/or community service.

Application period usually begins in October and closes in December.

CAA Scholarship Saskatchewan (Scholarships ranging from 1,000 to 2,500 dollars)

CAA Saskatchewan awards entrance scholarships of \$2,500 each to students attending the province's major post-secondary educational facilities - University of Saskatchewan, University of Regina and Sask Poly Tech. Applicants must be either a CAA Saskatchewan Member or child of a member, and a resident of Saskatchewan. CAA Saskatchewan also awards an entrance scholarship to an employee or child of an employee. The successful candidate is determined by academic excellence and selected by CAA Saskatchewan.

Application deadlines vary.

Canadian Engineering Memorial Foundation Scholarships

These scholarships are available to female students entering Engineering. Various awards are available with varying criteria.

Application deadlines are in January.

Canadian Federation of Independent Grocers

CFGIF offers a variety of scholarships to current CFGIF members (retail, associate, affiliate) family members of an employee of a current CFGIF member. A 1000-word essay is required based on the following topic: Given all of the consolidation that has taken place in the grocery industry, what are some of the strategic changes the independent or franchised grocer will need to implement to remain successful?

Application deadline is June 15.

Canadian Hearing Services National Scholarship Program

Canadian Hearing Services proudly offers scholarships to Deaf and hard of hearing students to help break down barriers to higher education and build brighter futures.

Scholarships of \$3,000 a year for full-time students and \$1,000 a year for part-time students are awarded to top qualified candidates who are pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited institution, inside or outside of Canada. Once secured, students may receive an annual award for up to four years. Awards may cover tuition, residence or educational resources. The exact number of awards will be dependent on the number and ranking of qualified applicants.

Application deadline is May 25.

Canadian Hospitality Foundation

The Canadian Hospitality Industry offers over \$200,000 in scholarships for students wishing to pursue a career in the hospitality, foodservice and tourism industry across Canada annually.

Application deadlines vary.

Canadian Merit Scholarship Foundation (Loran Award)

Awarded to talented young Canadians on the basis of character, service and leadership potential. A Loran Award includes four years of funding for undergraduate studies and a comprehensive enrichment program. For more information go to the Loran Scholarship website. Up to 30 National Awards valued at \$75,000 over four years at select universities. There are 42 Finalist Awards of \$3000 and 40 Regional Awards of \$2000. ***To be considered to be a sponsored applicant, please see Student Services once the school year commences (after you read through the application).***

Applications are due mid-October of each year.

Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists Scholarship

The student must be pursuing a course of studies directed toward a career in exploration geophysics or be a dependent of a CSEG member who will be entering university. In order to qualify for an award, students must be enrolled at a Canadian university in an academic program leading to an exploration geophysics career in industry, teaching or research. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic performance, financial need, interest in geophysics and extra-curricular activities.

Application deadline is November.

Canadian Welding Association

The CWA Foundation Secondary School Awards program was founded in 2014 for the purposes of promoting and encouraging the pursuit of post-secondary education in welding. The awards are for students who show an aptitude and passion for the welding industry and/or financial need and are applying to a certified welding program offered by a publicly funded Canadian College or University.

Applications deadline TBD.

Canadian Wildlife Federation (Orville Erickson Memorial Scholarships)

These are awarded once per year to post-secondary students in the field of conservation. The fund is administered by the Canadian Wildlife Foundation and is financed entirely by private-sector donations in memory of Orville Erickson, a prominent Canadian conservationist and past CWF president.

Application deadline is usually May 25 of each year.

Capsle Bursary (\$1000)

Capsle provides a bursary to provide financial assistance to students entering post-secondary Education and/or Law programs. One \$1,000 bursary is available for the academic year (the "Bursary").

Please see Student Services for the application. Application deadline has been May 31.

Carlyle Murray Education Foundation Scholarship (\$2000)

Any Grade 12 student in a Regina area high school planning to attend a post-secondary school in Saskatchewan. Applicants will be considered based on academic performance, extracurricular involvement, and financial need.

The application deadline has been May 21.

Catholic Women's League of Canada – Social Justice Award (\$1000)

This award is open to Grade 12 females who demonstrate involvement in social justice activities. Recommendation of a pastor is required. Award must be used to finance participation in a social justice activity either locally or abroad. Priority will be given to CWL members or relatives of CWL members. This is a yearly award that may be given to the same candidate repeatedly over the course of 10 years or distributed among several applicants. Academic standing and background will be a consideration but not the determining factor.

Application deadline is usually April 30. Please see Student Services for application details or email m.nordick@sasktel.net.

Conexus Youth Leadership Awards (30 X \$500)

We are excited to offer the Youth Leadership Award. This award is an opportunity for you, our young Conexus Credit Union members, to share the contributions you have made to school life and your community through volunteering while perfecting your leadership skills.

Application deadline March 31st.

Dalton Camp Award (\$10,000)

This is an essay competition on the link between democracy and the media in Canada.

Application deadline is in December.

Disability Awards Portal

This is a portal to awards and scholarships for students with disabilities studying at Canada's colleges and universities.

Application information and deadlines vary depending on the scholarship.

Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation (\$15,000)

This foundation supports students who are in the early stages of pursuing their career as an artist. Applicants must be 18 years of age.

Application Information

"Explore" (formally called the "Summer Language Bursary Program")

This is a bursary offered to students who have completed grade 11. Recipients are randomly accepted. The bursary covers tuition fees, instructional materials, meals and accommodations for five weeks of French instruction and activities in your choice of many locations across Canada.

Applications are due February 15 (deadline sometimes extended)

Exner Scholarships – The Allan and Darlene Exner Scholarships (6 x \$1250)

The Exner Scholarships have been graciously set up by the Exner Family in celebration of Allan and Darlene's 50th Anniversary. Two of these scholarships will be granted to students attending a university, two are granted to students attending at Technical Institute or Apprenticeship program and two will be granted to Indigenous students registered in a post-secondary institution. Applications for this scholarship come out in March/April.

Father Burns Council of the Knights of Columbus Scholarship (\$450)

Father Burns Council of the Knights of Columbus is offering a \$450 scholarship to students who attend St. Cecilia's Parish or who is a son or daughter, grandson or granddaughter of a member in good standing of Father Burns Council 5949 of the Knights of Columbus.

The application deadline has been April 30.

Father Ted Colleton Scholarship

Three prizes: \$1500 first prize, \$800 second prize and \$500 third prize. Applicants are required to write an essay based on an issue (topic changes annually).

Application This scholarship is available for Grade 11 and 12 students.

Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria Scholarships (Several @ \$1500)

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Awards Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria (Canada) Scholarships annually. The number of scholarships awarded is determined by the earnings of the scholarship trust.

An applicant must be:

- A Canadian student entering freshman year of an undergraduate program leading to a baccalaureate degree at a college or university in Canada.
- A member in good standing in a Canadian council of the Knights of Columbus, or the son or daughter of such a member or deceased member. (Not limited to Fourth Degree members.)

Each scholarship of \$1,500 is awarded on the basis of academic excellence and is renewable each year of study, pending satisfactory academic performance, to a total of four years.

Application order form has been due at the beginning of May.

Gerry McCudden Memorial Scholarship Award (\$2000)

This scholarship is open to RCSD Grade 12s who have an average of 80% or higher in their Grade 12 year. Leadership potential and/or participation in leadership roles in school or community is necessary. See Student Services for the Personal Essay prompt (500-word essay required). Students must be accepted into a post-secondary institution for the fall.

Application deadline has been June 1.

Girl Guides of Canada (\$1000-\$2000)

The National Scholarship Program is one of the ways that Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada (GGC) recognizes girls and adult Members who embody the Mission and Values of the organization. This program supports “registered Members” who continue in Guiding, while they pursue their education / training at a recognized post-secondary institution. More than 25 awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,000. The number of scholarships awarded varies from year to year.

Application deadline is April.

Girls Impact the World Scholarship Awards (\$5000)

The ConnectHER Film Festival is an international youth competition that welcomes short films about issues that impact women and girls. Before making a film for submission, please read all of the following entry requirements:

A) Films must focus on one of our topic areas. Categories include global girls' education, women and work, ending violence against women, women refugees, women's global health issues, women and the environment, women, and girls in tech, and redefining beauty.

B) We accept every type of filmmaking form and style; whether animation or live-action, documentary or narrative.

C) Filmmakers must be 13 to 25 years old at the submission date. That means that scripts, storyboards, directing, cinematography, editing, etc., must be done by people who meet this age requirement. Actors can be any age.

D) Films must be original works that have not yet been screened at other major film festivals.

E) Films must have been completed after January 1.

F) Films must be 3 to 6 minutes long.

G) Film file formats accepted are .mov and .mp4. HD resolution and optimized sound quality are highly preferred. Digital submission through Google Drive is preferred, but WeTransfer or Dropbox also works.

H) All films must be subtitled in English.

I) Films must be submitted by the deadline to qualify. No late submissions will be accepted.

J) If your film contains any graphic content, include a warning near the beginning of the film. ConnectHER has full discretion about accepting films, particularly in instances where film submissions contain nudity, profanity, violence, or sexually explicit content.

K) PowerPoints will not be accepted. Films must have some cinematic value.

Application deadline has been June 1.

Global Lift Equipment Scholarship (\$500)

Using implements carried by Global Lift Equipment, applicants must submit a short story using an inanimate object as the main character.

Application deadline is in June.

Gloria Archer Legacy Bursary (First Nations University of Canada) (\$2500)

The Gloria Archer Legacy Bursary is affiliated with Knight Archer Insurance Ltd. The fund is established to provide a bursary to an individual that is enrolled in the First Nations University of Canada – Indigenous

Business & Public Administration; Bachelor of Administration preference for Accounting, Entrepreneurship or Management. The bursary is to assist the recipient in the continuation of their course of studies.

The Knight Archer Insurance Ltd. Board of Directors, based on the following eligibility criteria will award a bursary, valued at \$2,500 to one individual annually.

Eligibility & Selection Criteria

The recipient of the Gloria Archer Insurance Bursary:

- Must be a full-time registered First Nations University of Canada Indigenous student; and
- Be accepted in First Nations University of Canada – Indigenous Business & Public Administration.

Got a Spine Scholarship (\$500)

This scholarship is sponsored by Arctic Chiropractic Clinic and requires applicants to research treatment of back injuries.

Application deadline has been May 2.

Governor General's Awards in Commemoration of the Persons Case (2 X \$5000)

These awards recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the goal of equality for women and girls in Canada. Students must receive a nomination from a community member.

Nomination forms are required.

Henry Baker Scholarship Program (City of Regina)

The City of Regina awards 13 scholarships through the Henry Baker Scholarship Program.

Application deadline is in June.

Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Scholarship and Citizenship Award (\$1000)

The Herbert H. Carnegie Future Aces Foundation offers scholarships to students from across Canada who exhibit exemplary citizenship qualities and who are in need of financial assistance to further their educational goals.

Application deadline has been mid-January.

Horatio Alger Association of Canada (various scholarships)

The Horatio Alger Association of Canada has various scholarships. Please check out their website.

This association wants to support the next generation of workers who will contribute to the Canadian economy across a wide variety of vocational and technical sectors. Scholarships of up to \$3,000 are available for 25 deserving applicants who display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity and are pursuing paths to employment. To be eligible you must be applying in Fall of 2024 to a **vocational or technical program** at a government or not for profit institution with direct pathways to employment.

Application deadline is June 15 2024

There are also scholarships of up to \$10,000 awarded to full-time students (grade 11 high school students) with financial need (family income under \$65,000) who have demonstrated integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, a commitment to pursue a post-secondary education, a desire to contribute to society, and a good academic record.

Application deadline has been March 15.

Innovation Credit Union Scholarship (up to \$5000)

This scholarship is open to students who reside in Saskatchewan and who will be enrolled in a Canadian full-time post-secondary program. Please review application details in the link below.

Application deadline is end of May.

Indspire Charity Foundation

Indspire is the largest supporter of Indigenous education outside the federal government. To date Indspire has awarded more than \$50 million in scholarships and bursaries to over 14,000 First Nation, Inuit and Métis recipients nationwide. Indspire disperses funds to Indigenous youth across Canada, covering all disciplines in four funding categories: Fine Arts, Oil and Gas and Trades and Technology, Health Careers and Post-Secondary Education.

Application deadlines vary depending on the scholarship being applied to.

Insurance Brokers Association of Saskatchewan (IBAS) Young Community Leader Bursary (\$7200)

To celebrate the brokers 72 year in Saskatchewan, the 'IBAS Young Community Leader Bursary' application will grant \$7200 in 2024. This award is for grade 12 students entering post secondary education. An essay is part of this application.

Application deadline has been May 31st.

IWSH Essay Scholarship (3 awards @ \$1500)

The purpose of this essay is to acquaint the uninitiated with the crucial importance the plumbing industry plays in our everyday lives. To introduce students to the global impact of IWSH projects.

Applicant must be in Grade 12 or enrolled or accepted as a full-time (12 credit hours) student in an accredited technical school, community college, trade school, four-year accredited college or university, or an apprentice program.

Essays must be submitted via email to essay@iwsh.org.

Application deadline has been April 30.

Irene Adler Prize (\$1000)

The competition is open to women commencing or continuing to pursue a Bachelor's, Master's, or Ph. D degree in journalism, creative writing, or literature at a recognized post-secondary institution in the United States or Canada in the upcoming academic year. Each application consists of two (2) elements:

A) A 500-word essay in English on one of the following three topics:

Which story from your life best illustrates why writing is important to you?

If you could embark on an adventure anywhere in the world, what would it be?

What is a mystery that you'd love to solve via your writing?

Each essay must have its own original title. The applicant's name, mailing address, phone number, and email address must appear on the first page. All personal information will be kept strictly confidential.

James Lee Foundation Scholarship (up to \$5000)

The scholarship is open to emerging creative talent from across Canada wanting to enter into the advertising industry. Entrants must be non-professional Canadian residents over the age of 16. All fields of creativity related to the advertising community will be considered. (E.g. writers, art directors, film makers, recording artists, illustrators, digital artists, etc.).

Application deadline is September.

Jean Lumb Foundation Awards (16 @ \$1000)

The 24th annual Jean Lumb Awards will be presented to sixteen outstanding students who have achieved excellence in:

Academics, Athletics, The Arts, Community Services, Defense of the Environment, Dignity of Life, Innovation, Leader of Tomorrow. Eligibility: Enrolled full-time in any grade in a high school or secondary school in Canada; Canadian citizen or permanent resident; of Chinese heritage

Application deadline is end of May.

Junior Citizen of the Year (4 X \$3000)

The Saskatchewan Weekly Newspapers Association will be taking nominations for Junior Citizen of the Year from Dec 1st to April 30th. These prestigious awards are given to Saskatchewan youth who: have a positive lifestyle, are dedicated to community and school, have a strong sense of caring and responsibility, have the ability to overcome life's challenges, inspire others.

Nomination deadline is end of April.

Kin Canada Bursaries (35 x \$1000)

Awarded annually based on financial need, community/volunteer involvement and knowledge of Kin Canada.

Application deadline date has been February 1 annually.

Leavitt Machinery (\$500)

This scholarship requires applicants to write an essay about safety procedures and injury prevention.

Application deadline has been May 1.

The Leonard Foundation (140 X \$1000)

Students must be enrolled as full-time students and must demonstrate financial need. Please read the scholarship criteria carefully.

The Nominator deadline has been March 15 annually.

Les Donnelly Scholarship (Saskatchewan Safety Council)

This scholarship is awarded annually up to a maximum of \$2000 to a Saskatchewan resident who is enrolled in a college or university level program. Applicants must complete the required eligibility questions and submit their application by May 31st annually. More information and applications are available in Student Services.

Application deadline is May 31 annually.

Lift Parts Express Scholarship (\$500)

Applicants are required to write an essay based on the following topic: Going to college is a big financial commitment. Write an essay that outlines how much you expect to spend to finish your schooling, how you intend to pay for your schooling, and what you expect your job to be once you are finished your schooling.

Application deadline is June.

Lime Connect Pathways Scholarship (2 awards @ \$1000)

Lime Connect believes strongly in the potential of high school students who happen to have all types of disabilities and are committed to supporting their future. In 2019, we were pleased to launch our inaugural *Pathways Scholarship* designed for current high school seniors who are pursuing a degree at a four-year university or college in either the U.S. or Canada.

Recipients of the Lime Connect *Pathways Scholarship* each receive \$1,000 in support of their university/college studies. The awards are merit-based, but financial need will be taken into consideration. Applicants should match with the following criteria:

- Have, or consider themselves to have a visible or invisible disability*
 - ** An individual with a disability is defined as someone who has or considers themselves to have, a long-term, or recurring, issue that impacts one or more major activities that others may consider to be a daily function); this definition also includes the perception among others that a disability exists. We know that 90% of disabilities on campus are invisible, and candidates with all disabilities are encouraged to apply.*
- Grade 12 graduating students
- Accepted to, or applied and awaiting acceptance to, a 4-year university or college in the U.S. or Canada for the upcoming post-secondary school year.
- Intending to be enrolled full time in that 4-year university or college in the fall.

Application deadline has been May 30.

MADD Canada Bursary Program (\$4000-\$8000)

The MADD Canada Bursary Fund is for Canadian students who have had an immediate family member (mother, father, legal guardian, or sibling) killed in an impaired-driving related crash and are pursuing any full-time education program that is approved by a provincial Ministry of Education.

Application deadline has been May 31st.

Mary Booth Memorial Scholarship (French Immersion)

The following criteria will be used in the selection process:

- Each successful candidate will be enrolled in, or have completed, a grade 12 French program (or equivalent) and have the intention of entering a post-secondary program in the **French language**;
- The candidate should demonstrate excellence in their leadership ability; and,

- The candidate should display willingness to help other further their learning in FSL.

A completed application form must be received by the Canadian Parents for French - Saskatchewan Branch Office.

Application Deadline is the end of June (28th for 2024)

Masonic Scholarships (Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan)

The Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan as well as many Lodges sponsor a number of awards, scholarships, and bursaries. Multiple awards are available.

Application deadlines vary depending on scholarship.

National Union of Public and General Employees 2016 Scholarships (4 x \$1500)

Each year, the National Union of Public and General Employees (NUPGE) offers four scholarships that reflect its pursuit of equal opportunity for all workers. They are open to the children of the National Union's 340,000 members who are starting a post-secondary education.

Application deadline is July.

Nelson Civic Leadership Scholarships and Indigenous Student Scholarships (3 x \$5000 for both)

Nelson Scholarships support community-minded student leaders in achieving their educational goals. These \$5000 scholarships will be awarded to students who have demonstrated academic success, personal strength, preservation of culture and determination in their commitment to civic engagement and leadership.

Application deadline is June.

Newcomer Bursary (Regina Open Door Society)

Up to eight awards of \$2500.00 are available to refugees who have landed in Canada in the past 10 years.

Application deadline has been May 16.

Odenza Marketing Group Scholarship (\$500)

Applicants must write 2 essays.

Application deadline has been March 30.

Odenza Vacations College Scholarship (\$500)

Applicants must write an essay about "why they want to go to college/university".

Application deadline June.

Optimist International Essay Contest

Students must submit an essay based on a specific topic. The essay contest gives young people the opportunity to write about their own opinions regarding the world in which they live.

Application deadline is April 15.

PHCC Educational Foundation Scholarships

Starting an apprentice program, trade school or college this Fall? The time to apply for a scholarship is NOW! These scholarships are open to Canadian or US applicants who are currently enrolled in or plan to enroll in a PHCC-approved plumbing or HVACR apprentice program.

The PHCC Educational Foundation and its industry partners are teaming up to provide financial assistance to students pursuing a career in the p-h-c industry.

Application deadline is May 1.

Pipeline Contractors Association of Canada Student Bursary

The PLCAC awards bursaries in the fall of each year to a son or daughter of parents who derive their principal income from pipeline construction.

Applications are due in October.

Prince Edward Arts Scholarships

Multiple scholarships varying from \$1000 - \$2500. Available for students in any fine arts discipline.

Application deadline is May 1 annually.

Prince of Wales and Duchess of Cornwall Scholarship (20 X \$500)

This scholarship for Grade 11 students is based on the applicant's ability to provide information that highlights the following areas: leadership, responsibilities outside of school, financial need, and academic performance.

Only one student from each school can be nominated by an awards committee. Following review of the application requirements, interested students must speak to Student Services by February 15th.

Applications must be accompanied by a letter of recommendation from the school. The deadline for this application has been March 15.

Queens's Diamond Jubilee Scholarship (6 X \$1000)

This scholarship is based on student's ability to provide information about their leadership skills, responsibilities out of school, financial support needed, and their academic performance. ***Only one student from each school can be nominated by an awards committee. Following review of the application requirements, interested students must speak to Student Services by February 15 for consideration for this award.***

Applications must be accompanied by a letter of recommendation from the school. The deadline has been March 15.

Quest for Excellence School Bursary Program

The Quest for Excellence Program is a bursary program for grade 12 students in Western Canada. It was established by RE/MAX of Western Canada to recognize the success and ongoing pursuits of Western Canadian students in regard to leadership and community contribution initiatives. RE/MAX of Western Canada will award 16 bursaries of \$1,000 each to qualifying Grade 12 students. In addition, the 16 bursary winners will be entered into a draw and one lucky recipient will receive a RE/MAX Hot Air Balloon ride for two.

Applications are due by March.

Regina Catholic Schools' Education Support Professionals' Association Scholarship (2 @ \$300)

The Grade 12 application must be a child/ward of a support staff member of RCSD holding a current membership in the RCSD's ESPA for the past 2 years or more. The applicant must have a minimum academic average of 75% and be registered for post-secondary programming. The applicant must be involved in and demonstrate leadership in the school, the church, and the community. Students can be out of high school for a maximum of 1 year and still apply.

Applications are usually due mid-June.

Regina Catholic School Teachers' Association Scholarship (\$1000)

The Regina Catholic Schools Teachers' Association Scholarship, in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), shall be awarded annually to a graduating child/stepchild/ward of a member of the Regina Catholic Schools Teachers' Association.

The requirements for this scholarship are: a) Child/Stepchild/Ward of a current, superannuated, or deceased member of the RCSTA; b) Academic excellence in all classes required for graduation including Catholic Studies or its equivalent; c) Involvement and demonstrated leadership in: the school, the community, the church/parish; and confirmation of entrance into a post-secondary program.

Application available from Student Services. The deadline is usually May 31.

Resolute Legal Disability Lawyers Scholarship (2 X \$2500)

Graduating student (enrolled for upcoming fall in post-secondary program) must have a parent or guardian who is unable to work due to a disability requiring one of the following supports:

- Short or Long-term disability insurance benefits
- CPP Disability benefits
- Workers' compensation benefits
- Provincial disability benefits (i.e., ODSP, AISH, SAID, PWD, etc.)

Application deadline is usually June 1.

Retail as a Career Scholarship Program (1 X \$5000; 1 X \$3000; 18 X \$1000)

This essay scholarship is available for students pursuing a retail, business or marketing-related program and who are currently working part-time or full-time within the retail industry.

Application deadline is usually March 15.

Ringette Canada Scholarships (multiple amounts)

Application deadline is usually April 30.

Royal Bank of Canada Scholarship

The Royal Bank offers a diverse set of scholarship programs worth over \$300,000 a year to help address the critical need for student funding across Canada. High school graduates can apply for scholarships based on undergraduate status, Aboriginal Status, Junior A Hockey Players, Employees children of RBC, etc.

Applications are available in December.

The Royal Canadian Legion Saskatchewan Command - Jack Moore Memorial Scholarship/Burgess Bursaries (20 X \$300)

Open to a child, or a great-grandchild of a veteran, of a still-serving military member, or an RCMP member.

Application deadline is near the end of August.

Ruth Hancock Scholarship (3 X \$2000)

Presented to students enrolled in a recognized communications course with a goal to enter a career in Canadian broadcasting.

Application deadline is usually June 30 annually.

Saskatchewan Agriculture Student Scholarship Program (10 X \$1000)

Awarded to students entering agriculture related post-secondary studies. Applicants are asked to produce a 750-word essay or 3-minute video describing why "agriculture, today more than ever, is a vibrant, diverse industry".

Applications are usually due March 1.

Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation Association (SPRA) Future Leaders Scholarship

Up to \$3000 awards to scholarship recipients.

Applications are usually due end of March.

Saskatchewan School Boards Association Education Scholarships (Building Brighter Futures) (2 X \$3000)

Each year, the Saskatchewan School Boards Association awards two \$3,300 scholarships to graduating high school students who remain in Saskatchewan in post-secondary study:

Degree Program Scholarship: \$3,000

Technical/Trade Program Scholarship: \$3,000

Scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of demonstrated good character, community leadership, financial need, and a 500-word essay.

Application deadline is usually Aug. 31 each year.

Saskatchewan Truckers Association A (1 X \$3000; 2 X \$1000)

Available to employees and company members, as well as their spouses and children.

Application is available online.

Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarship

These are awarded to selected, eligible high school graduates throughout the province who have completed the SYA Program and will be pursuing a career in the skilled trades. The scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, will be awarded to graduating students nominated by selected provincial high schools each June.

More information on this scholarship. Deadline end of March.

SaskTel Scholarships (7 X \$3000)

Every year, SaskTel awards 7 scholarships of \$3,000 to students attending post-secondary institutions in Saskatchewan who are studying in a field directly related to information and communications technology.

Application deadline is end of March.

SaskTel - Gord Kuhn Scholarship (\$3000)

Offered in honour of Gord Kuhn, a long-time employee of SaskTel. This scholarship will be awarded to a current SaskTel employee (or immediate family member of a SaskTel employee) attending a post-secondary institution in Saskatchewan studying in a field directly related to telecommunications.

Application deadline is March.

Schulich Leader Scholarship

25 awards worth \$80,000 over 4 years, and 25 awards worth \$100,000. Candidates must be enrolling in a program at one of 20 pre-selected universities in Canada and must be studying in one of the following areas: Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics. ***Only one student from each school can be nominated by an awards committee. Following review of the application requirements, interested students must speak to Student Services by December 1 for consideration for this award.***

More information and applications for this scholarship are available online. Deadline is mid-January.

SGEU Scholarships (over \$60,000 in awards)

Available to members and their children.

Application deadlines vary.

SGI Anniversary Scholarships (4 X \$2500)

To be eligible, a student must be a child/legal dependent of an employee of SGI or its wholly owned subsidiaries.

Application deadlines in September.

SGI Corporate Scholarship (7 X \$2500)

This is open to students in a certificate, diploma or degree program related to SGI business needs in Saskatchewan, Alberta, Manitoba and Ontario.

Application deadlines in October.

Sing Canada Harmony

The charitable wing of the barbershoppers, offers multiple scholarships to provide individual vocal training. Students must be current choral students who can demonstrate the ability to transfer experience and knowledge gained to other members of their choral group. Preference will be given to new applicants.

Application deadlines are usually March 1, June 1, Sept. 1 and Dec.1 of each year.

Solar Action Alliance (\$1000)

Solar Action Alliance is a group of environmentalists who want to spread the word about the most clean, reliable, and abundant source of renewable energy: the sun. All applicants are required to write an essay.

Application deadline is usually July 1 annually.

Stacey Levitt Memorial Award (\$2500)

Stacey was a high school student in Toronto who was accidentally killed by a car while she was out jogging. In her memory, Stacey's parents created an annual \$2500 award for a student who emulates that spirit and ideals that their daughter had before her tragic passing.

Application deadline is March.

St. John Ambulance

St. John Ambulance's Bursaries and Scholarships are available to volunteers who are members of St. John Ambulance Community Services programs.

Application deadline is usually May 15 annually.

Stuck at Prom (over \$50,000 in awards)

This scholarship requires applicants to design and create a prom outfit made out of duct tape.

Application deadline is June.

TCU Financial

You will automatically be considered for a Guaranteed Entrance Scholarship when you apply for admission. These scholarships recognize your academic achievements and are awarded based on your admission average.

Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships are uSask's highest valued, renewable entrance scholarships and are awarded based on academics, leadership and contributions to school and community life. Five of these awards, known as the Circle of Honour Awards, are designated for Indigenous students. To be considered,

complete your application for admission by December 1, and fill out and submit the online application for Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships in PAWS by December 15.

Competitive Entrance Awards include numerous scholarships and bursaries that can be accessed by many students with diverse experiences. You can be considered based on academic achievement, financial need and/or contributions to school and community life. Some awards recognize particular backgrounds, acknowledge contributions to certain clubs or reward achievement in music and athletics. All entering students are encouraged to apply. To be considered, complete your application for admission by February 15, and fill out and submit the online application for Competitive Entrance Awards in PAWS by March 1.
