






## Miller Code of Honour

## Student Success

- We believe that all of our students will be able to achieve their full academic potential if they adhere to these four criteria for success:
- Regular and punctual attendance.
- 2. A positive and willing attitude each and every day when arriving to class, prepared to learn.
- 3. The completion of all assignments; this includes diagnostic, formative and summative assessments.
- 4. Preparation for all assessments this involves not just reviewing the material, but arriving to class with the appropriate materials and taking responsibility for all material missed due to absence.



# Academic Integrity

- All teachers and students at Miller Comprehensive Catholic High School are responsible for the academic integrity of the school.
- The International Centre for Academic Integrity defines academic integrity as a commitment to six fundamental values: honesty, trust, fairness, respect, responsibility and courage.
- Both staff and students have a shared responsibility when it comes to creating a culture of academic integrity. This includes actions such as cheating, plagiarism, submitting the work of a friend, parent, or a purchased paper as well as ethical use of artificial intelligence.





# Artificial Intelligence

- Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools have presented both opportunities and challenges in Education.
- Al tools, via programs and algorithms, generate and revise many kinds of products.
- It is a teacher's responsibility to communicate assessment expectations, and this includes when and if Al tools can be used.
- It is a student's responsibility to ensure they are following the assessment expectations.





# Graduation Requirements

- To be eligible for graduation students must:
  - complete their 24 required credits by June 30, 2024
  - Be passing all required classes by Friday, June 7, 2024
    - This includes all online classes as well

# Graduation Requirements


- To be eligible for graduation students must have the following credits:
  - Two of ELA A10, ELA B10, ELA A11 or ELA B11
  - ELA 20
  - Two of ELA A30, ELA B30, ELA A31 or ELA B31
  - A Social Science (one of Law 30, Psychology 20 or 30, History 20)
  - Math 20/21
  - Science 20/21 (Health Science, Physical Science or Environmental Science)
  - Canadian Studies 30/31 or Native Studies 30/31
  - Catholic Studies 30
  - One of Wellness 10 or Physical Education 20 or 30















## Attendance

- The Education Act, 1995, 150(3) clearly stipulates that every pupil shall attend school regularly and punctually.
- All students must attend a minimum of 85% of any class for which they are registered. Any student who is absent for more than 15% (15 periods – excused or unexcused, suspensions included) of any class may be dismissed from the class.
- Extended Leaves:
  - Students must have a plan in place with teachers to stay up to date on their students before leaving.
  - A Prior Knowledge Form must be completed and submitted to the office in advance of the leave request.







# School Emergencies

Students must become familiar with rehearsed emergency procedures and the specific exit route posted in each classroom.

## **Fire**

- Do not run, push or crowd. Move only at a quick and steady walk.
- Once outside, assemble in the designated area away from the building.
- Do not re-enter the building until the all-clear signal has sounded.

## Lockdowns

- The threat is in the building
- Follow your teacher's instruction within the classroom
- Remain quiet and no cell phones
- If in the hallway go for cover

   bathroom or leave the building
- Do not open the door for anyone – police will have a key to open the door to end a lockdown

## Secure the Building

- A threat is outside the building.
- Classes continue as usual directed by the Regina Police Service.
- All doors are locked.
- No one is allowed in or out of the building.



## Dress Code

- Dressing for the Business of Education and Faith-based Learning!
- In Regina Catholic School, all staff and students are expected to wear clothing that is appropriate for the learning environment and respectful of our faith values.
- Please refer to our student handbook & RCSD Administrative Application 9210 which outlines the division guidelines regarding the dress code.
- Dressing for success and the business of education means wearing school appropriate attire. Clothes that have logos or images that promote racism or discrimination, promote violence, drug and alcohol use, or organizations/values not aligned with our faith are not permitted. Clothing should be respectful to all, fostering an inclusive and safe school environment. Clothing should allow students to move freely and fully participate in all classroom and activities without risk of exposure or embarrassment.



## Locks & Lockers

- All students must have a Miller lock for their locker.
- Please note: any outside locks will not be allowed. Students must keep their combinations to themselves and their lockers locked to prevent theft.
- Students are not to share lockers. Locker numbers will be on the student's timetable which can be accessed through the Student/Parent Portal.
- Please note that students are not to bring backpacks into the classrooms, all items not required for class shall be kept in student lockers during the day.
- See the office if you don't have a locker





# Alcohol, Drugs, Smoking, Tobacco & Vaping

- Students are expected to be free from alcohol or drugs when attending school and school related functions.
- Possession and/or sale of such substances is prohibited.
- All school division property and facilities are free of tobacco, tobacco products, smokeless tobacco, environmental smoke, e-cigarettes, and vaporizers or other smoking alternatives on our property.
- Consequences include education, confiscation, suspensions & expulsions.





## Cell Phones

- All students will park cell phones, and any headphones in the teacher designated area (i.e., cell phone pockets). Cell phones will be turned to "silent mode" or off.
- Students will not access their cell phone or headphones unless the teacher gives permission. Typically, cell phones will be accessed only during educational opportunities and/or at the end of class.
- Students are not permitted to bring their cell phone or headphones with them in the hallways or to the washroom during class time.
- Failure to adhere to classroom rules and procedures may result in a meeting with Administration.





## Bathrooms

- Bathrooms must remain places for individuals to use for the intended use of the room.
  - Ex: Washing hands, using the toilet for the intended purpose.
- Bathrooms are not a place to congregate for any reason.
   Students seen in bathrooms will be asked to leave.
- Vandalism in bathrooms will not be tolerated.
  - Bathrooms will be closed.

• Harassment on the basis of any personal attribute such as race, culture, gender, disability, physical size or weight, or sexual orientation will not be tolerated.

#### VIOLENCE

• Disagreements are to be settled in a fair, non-violent manner and without the use of threats.

#### WFAPONS

 Students can expect a safe environment free from any weapon or dangerous object.

- It is expected that students accept responsibility for their actions and for the consequences arising from their actions.
- Students engaging in conduct outlined in the handbook and administrative applications may face consequences.
- Consequences will have a range from detention to suspension depending on the act and severity.
